


NOTICE OF JUDICIAL POSITION VACANCY

The Tenth Judicial District Nominating Commission will convene on or about May 8, 2017, to interview and appoint a district magistrate judge to fill the vacancy on the Johnson County District Court, sitting in Olathe, Kansas, that will be created by the May 12, 2017, retirement of the Honorable Michael H. Farley.

The Commission welcomes recommendations of nominees to fill the position, but recommendations must be accompanied by a nomination form that is completed and signed by the nominee. The nominating form is available from the Clerk of the Johnson County District Court or the Clerk of the Appellate Court or on-line at <http://www.jocojnc.org> or www.kscourts.org.

For a nominee to be considered, an original and 15 copies of the completed nominating form, together with a like number of any supporting documents, together with one (1) signed and notarized Authorization of Release form must be received by the Office of the District Attorney, 5th Floor, Johnson County Courthouse, 100 N. Kansas, Olathe, KS 66061, on or before **Noon, on the 4th day of April, 2017**. Nominating forms cannot be accepted by fax or on-line, and **late submissions will be rejected**.

The statutes require a district magistrate judge to be a graduate of a high school or secondary school or the equivalent; to be a resident of Johnson County at the time of taking the oath of office and maintain residency in Johnson County while holding such office; and to either be a lawyer admitted to practice law in Kansas or pass a certification examination given by the Supreme Court within 18 months, as provided by K.S.A. 20-334(b) and K.S.A. 20-337.
