Statutes require a district judge filling this position: (1) be regularly admitted to the practice of law in the State of Kansas; (2) be a resident of the Twenty-First Judicial District at the time of taking the oath of office and maintain residency in the Twenty-First Judicial District while holding such office; (3) have been engaged in the active practice of law for at least 5 years as either a lawyer, judge, or full-time teacher at an accredited law school. K.S.A. 20-334; see K.S.A. 4-222. Nonresidents of the Twenty-First Judicial District should be aware of K.S.A. 20-2909(b) ("If there are not at least three attorneys deemed qualified by the district judicial nominating commission who reside in the judicial district and who are willing to accept the nomination to fill a vacancy in a district judge position, the nominating commission need not limit its consideration of nominees to attorneys residing in the judicial district.")

14. Please list any social media or internet accounts and provide corresponding handles, usernames, or any other names or labels by which you would be identified.
15. List courses in continuing legal education in which you have participated during the past five years.
16. List all legal associations and professional societies of which you are a member, and give the titles and dates of any office which you may have held in such groups and committees to which you belong(ed) and offices held.
17. For the last five years, list, in a fully identifiable fashion, all civic, charitable, sports-related or cultural organizations of which you have been a member, including the titles and dates of any offices which you have held and the activities in which you have been or are engaged in each such organization.
18. Are you a director or officer of any business or corporation? 23. Have you ever been the subject of public discipline imposed by a professional disciplinary body, subject to a fee dispute, or found in contempt? Explain. In each case, state in detail the circumstances and the outcome. Please include any complaints.
24. Do you have a professional, business, consanguineous or personal relationship with any member of the Judicial Nominating Commission to whom you are submitting this nomination form? If so, provide dates and a description of this relationship.

32. Attach a writing sample, preferably containing legal analysis and citation to authority, which effects your own work product.
33. Attach **no more than ten** letters of support. No letters received after the nomination form deadline will be considered.
34. Attach an executed copy of the release which accompanies this form.
