
Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9.01(e), the consolidated case will be scheduled for oral argument on Tuesday, April 8, 2008, at 9:00 a.m. in a special setting before this Court in the Supreme Court Courtroom, Kansas Judicial Center. Petitioners George R. Tiller, M.D. and Women's Health Care Services, Inc. will be allotted 20 minutes and will be the first to present argument. Petitioners Jane Doe and Ann Roe will be allotted 20 minutes and will be the second to argue. Petitioner Stephen N. Six, Kansas Attorney General will be allotted 20 minutes and will be the third to argue. Any of the petitioners may reserve a portion of their time for rebuttal, which will be presented in the

aforementioned order. The Respondents, collectively, will be allotted a total of 60 minutes and will be fourth to argue.

If any party wishes to submit additional briefing after this date, such briefs, no more than 25 pages in length, shall be filed in the Appellate Clerk's Office on or before 5:00 p.m., Monday, March 17, 2008, after which the Court will not accept any further briefing.
