


IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF KANSAS

Administrative Order No. 171

Re: Amended Designated Holidays for 2001

Pursuant to Section 9.10 of the Kansas Court Personnel Rules, and the executive memorandum issued by Governor Graves on December 7, 2001, Monday, December 24, 2001 has been added to the designated holidays for 2001. Observance of these holidays by a district court may be deferred whenever observance of the holiday would interfere with judicial proceedings in progress.

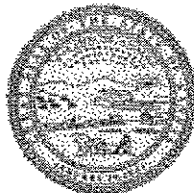

DATE: DECEMBER 7, 2001
SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL STATE HOLIDAY – MONDAY, DECEMBER 24, 2001

In accordance with K.A.R. 1-9-2, I hereby announce that I have designated Monday, December 24, 2001 as an additional state holiday for calendar year 2001. Declaring Monday, December 24, 2001 as a state holiday is a way to allow our state employees valuable time with family and friends, and flexibility for their holiday plans. Traditionally Christmas Eve has not been a paid holiday for state employees, but this year December 24 falls between a weekend and a Tuesday Christmas.

It is the intention of the holiday regulation that all full-time employees who are entitled to holidays receive credit for a holiday, and that partial credit be given to part-time employees who are entitled to holidays in accordance with K.A.R. 1-9-2.
