RULES RELATING TO ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS

Rule 709

LEGAL INTERNS

Supreme Court Rule 709 (b), (f), and (g) are hereby amended, effective the date of this order.

(b) Requirements and Limitations. In order to make an appearance as a legal intern pursuant to this rule, the student must:

....
(5) Be introduced to the court in which he or she is appearing by an attorney admitted to practice in that court.



(7) Certify in writing that he or she has read and will abide by the rules relating to discipline of attorneys (Supreme Court Rules 201 *et seq.*) and also subscribe to an oath that he or she will support the constitutions of the United States and the State of Kansas, and will faithfully perform the duties of a legal intern. Said certificate and oath are to be filed with the Clerk of the Appellate Courts.

(f) Post-Juris Doctorate students duly enrolled in an LL.M. program at the University of Kansas Law School, the Washburn University Law School, or the University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Law shall be eligible for a legal intern permit under the terms and conditions set forth above.

(f) (g) Miscellaneous. Nothing contained in this rule shall affect the right of any person who is not admitted to practice law to do anything that he might lawfully do prior to the adoption of this rule.
