

Frequently Asked Questions
Kansas 2019/20 Annual Attorney Registration

Q. Can all attorneys register online?

A. *During Phase 1 of the new attorney registration system, only currently active and inactive status attorneys in good standing may register online. Federal judges, disabled and retired status attorneys will need to mail in the registration form.*

Q. Do I need to create a new user account?

A. *To complete registration and pay the fee online, attorneys will need to [create](#) an account for this site since it is a new system.*

Q. If I mail in my registration form with my payment, do I still need to register online?

A. *No, only attorneys who want to complete their registration and pay their fee online need to register.*

Q. Are all credit cards accepted online?

A. *At this time, only Visa, Mastercard and Discover will be accepted.*

Q. I want to change from active to inactive for 2019/20, can I register online?

A. *Yes – online registration must be completed before midnight on June 30 in order to change your status and pay the lower inactive fee. Fees paid after June 30 will incur a \$100 late fee and you will be required to pay the fee for the status shown in your attorney record as of July 1, even if you want to change to inactive.*

Q. I am currently inactive and want to change to active, can I register online?

A. *No, changing to active status will not be available during Phase I of the implementation of the new attorney registration system. The paper registration form must be sent in with your payment. If you have been inactive two years or more, then a Request to Change Status form must also accompany your registration form and written request to change status. The form is available on our website at www.kscourts.org under the “Attorney Registration Office” tab.*

Q. I want to change to retired for 2019/20, can I register online?

A. *Yes – online registration must be completed before midnight on June 30 in order to change your status to retired and pay no fee. Online registration completed after June 30 will incur a \$100 late fee and you will be required to pay the fee for the status shown in your attorney record as of July 1, even if you want to change to retired.*

Q. I am currently retired, do I need to register online?

A. No, registration forms will be sent to all currently retired status attorneys. Address changes can be made on the form and returned to the Clerk's office in a self-addressed envelope that will be provided via US Mail. It is important to keep your address current with the Clerk's office due to mailings for the Nominating Commission elections.
