### Kansas Strong for Children and Families

### STRATEGIES & OUTCOMES



#### **Interagency and Community Advisory Board**

A cross-system collaboration among leaders and managers in Kansas that will:

- Build knowledge of needs and service gaps
- Use data and CQI, create action plans to address needs and service gaps
- Lead with shared outcomes & accountability

Target Population: Children and families involved with the child welfare system and needing services and supports



#### **Parent/Youth Facilitation**

A facilitation process for older youth (15+) and their parents that aims to reduce the number of out-of-home placements by engaging parents and youth in a meaningful problem-solving process, and connecting them with community services and supports

Target Population: Older youth (14+) with emotional and behavioral problems who are at risk of entering foster care



#### **Adoption Tracking Tool**

Case reporting tool that will reduce time to adoption by:

- Establishing clear timelines and benchmarks
- Providing a tool for agency workers and court/legal system to assist with communication of roles, responsibilities, and process

Target Population: Children and youth legally free for adoption and a case plan goal of adoption



#### KanCoach

Coaching program focused on developing and strengthening supervisory capacity and skills to promote quality frontline practice and improve outcomes. Priority topics are: safety/risk assessment & case planning, engagement, relative/kin connections, and secondary traumatic stress

Target Population: Children and youth with risk factors related to entry, reunification, and adoption


Children have permanency and stability in their living situations

### What is the ATT?

- A tracking tool for key tasks and timelines as a specific child in need of care (CINC) case moves forward to adoption
- A communication tool among caseworkers, judges, attorneys, and other court personnel.
- Targets efforts to identify barriers.
- Designed to support efficient and timely progress to adoption by using a standardized tool for tracking key benchmarks and time schedules for children legally free for adoption.
- Designed to support collaborative accountability.
- It is not meant to be punitive.

### Why does Kansas need the ATT?

- Kansas ranks 45<sup>th</sup> in the nation in non-permanent discharges from foster care.
- Kansas ranks 43<sup>rd</sup> in the nation in time to adoption.
- Time to adoption has increased 18% since 2015.




### How will the ATT be used?

- Caseworkers complete the tool for children who are legally free for adoption meaning:
  - o there has been termination of parental rights pursuant to court order; or
  - relinquishment of parental rights has been accepted and approved by the DCF Secretary and Guardian ad litem (GAL).
- Judges, attorneys, and caseworkers use the ATT as an information tool in court hearings.
- The ATT can be used to document barriers that get in the way of timely adoption which can result in:
  - Adoptions completed expeditiously
  - Improved permanency and stability

#### **Data Collected**

#### Surveys

- Web-based survey emailed monthly from July to December
- 50 people from all 6 pilot counties and all stakeholder groups responded

#### **Focus Groups/Interviews**

- 20 focus groups or interviews
- People from all 6 pilot counties and all stakeholder groups participated

### What did we learn from the pilot?

#### Surveys

#### On a scale of O (strongly disagree) to 4 (strongly agree), the ATT can:

Track adoption milestones that are completed: 2.9

Track adoption milestones that are in progress: 2.8

Identify barriers that may be slowing the adoption process: 2.5

Support good communication between the agency and court system: 2.5

Streamline the adoption process for the child: 2.4

Serve as a communication aid rather than as a punitive tool: 2.7

#### Focus Groups/Interviews

**Track Milestones:** Most stakeholders agreed that the ATT helps track milestones that are and are not completed.

**Identify Barriers:** Court and DCF stakeholders endorsed ATT as helping to identify barriers to adoption


Facilitate Communication: Court and DCF stakeholders endorsed between-stakeholder communication as being facilitated. Agency staff endorsed within agency communication.

**Streamline the Adoption Process:** Court and DCF stakeholders endorsed most strongly.

**Useful:** Most stakeholders endorsed the tool as potentially useful in some specific capacity.


### ATT pilot expansion — Phase 2

- •April 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021



ATT Full Implementation

- Statewide Implementation
  - Following successful pilot,
     DCF policy workgroup and
     SCTFPP approved adoption
     of ATT statewide
- Expansion to all remaining counties beginning July 1, 2021



### How will Kansas know this is making a difference?

- CFSR Case Record Review beginning January 1, 2021
  - Presence of ATT in adoption cases where child/youth is legally free
  - Adoption barriers\*
  - Time elapsed between benchmarks\*
- Use of Administrative data to assess short and long-term outcomes related to <u>adoption</u> <u>timeliness</u> and <u>permanency.</u>



\* Case review items still being finalized in partnership with DCF
